- NOTE: When the inseparable preposition ? is attached to the Qal infinitive construct and the first letter of the verbal root is a non-laryngeal, the vocal shewa under the inseparable preposition > changes to a short hireq and the vocal shewa under the first letter of the verbal root becomes a silent shewa (e.g. ユンタンス).
- (b) Translation of the Inseparable Preposition ? with the Infinitive Construct
 - i It may be translated "in order to" in which case it denotes purpose (e.g. ユラウノー "in order to write").
 - ii It may be translated by the English preposition "to" in which case it does not denote purpose (e.g. $202? D2\psi$ - "he ceased to write").

b. Without the Inseparable Prepositions (3, 3, and ?)

- It may be used as the subject of a sentence (e.g.
 ΔΙΟ Τ΄Δ ? "to learn is good").
- (3) It may be used after a noun in the construct state (e.g. T'か? のダー "a time of learning").
- <u>NOTE</u>: The infinitive construct may take an object whether it is used with or without an inseparable preposition, and if that object is definite, the sign of the object will precede it (e.g.) うつう ひゃ 'か?? - "in order to learn the book").
