- a. It may be used to negate the following verb (e.g. 721 %? "he did not remember").
- b. It may be used with both genders and numbers of the second person of the imperfect tense to express an emphatic prohibition (e.g. UDUP X? "you, man, shall not judge").
- B. Negative with a Nominal Sentence
 - 1. Identification of the Negative

The negative that is used with a nominal sentence is 7 ? × (non-existence).

- 2. Uses of the Negative
 - a. Absolute State (7 . K)

It is used as a verbal predicate to deny the existence of the idea expressed by the preceding word (e.g. ['X] [] - "and gold does not exist").

- b. Construct State (7'X)
 - (1) It may be used to deny the existence of the idea expressed by the following word (e.g. D) γ γ κ "there is no peace").
 - (2) It may be used before the subject of a nominal sentence to negate the sentence (e.g. בוֹנָע "the book is not good").
