D. State of the Dual Ending

The dual ending is always in the absolute state. It has no construct state. Therefore, if a word which would normally take a dual ending is used in the construct state, it takes a regular plural construct ending (e.g. ')'y' - "eyes of").

<u>NOTE</u>: The dual ending should not be confused with the plural ending on such words as "water" ( $\check{\mathcal{D}}$ ,  $\check{\mathcal{D}}$ ) and "heavens" ( $\check{\mathcal{D}}$ ).
