- (1) Write the base form (e.g. (7).
- (2) Change the vowel after the first letter of the verbal root to a long holem (e.g. 75).
- e. infinitive Construct

The form is 1'7.

- f. Participles
 - (1) Active Participle

The form is 12.

(2) Passive Participle

The form is 7.7.

NOTE: When an ending is added to the active or passive participle, the vowel of the participle does not change (e.g. 1727 - active participle, and 1727 - passive participle).

2. Derived Stems (All Other Stems)

The Ayin Yodh verb is formed like the Ayin Waw verb in these stems (e.g. Hiphil perfect - הָבִין וֹחָם).

E. Waw Consecutive with the Ayin Yodh Verb

The waw consecutive only makes a difference in the vowel pointing of the imperfect tense in the Qal and Hiphil stems where there is no sufformative except the first, common, singular. When it makes a difference in the vowel pointing of these stems, it causes the long hired after the first letter of the verbal root to change to a seghol (e.g.
