- (2) If faith without good works could save, then, the demons would be saved because they have that kind of faith and it even has an effect on them. However, the demons are not saved and neither are those who have this kind of faith. vs. 19
- 4. Arguments in support of the definition of the faith that saves vss. 20-26.
  - a. Argument from Abraham vss. 20-24

Abraham proved he had the faith that saves by obeying God and offering his son Isaac upon the altar. By this act of obedience his faith was perfected or completed and the Scripture was fulfilled, which said, "Abraham believed God, and it was imputed unto him for righteousness" (Gen. 15:6). As a result of his faith and the good work it produced, Abraham was called the friend of God.

b. Argument from Rahad vss 25,26

Rahab proved she had the faith that saves (Josh.2:11) by receiving the two spies into her home and sending the out of Jericho another way, i.e. by letting them down the wall of the city by a scarlet cord.
