

- c. Day 2
  - 1) He created an expanse called the sky and put it between the water.
  - 2) Thus there was water on top of the expanse and underneath the expanse.
- d. Day 3
  - 1) He gathered the waters into one place and dry ground appeared.
  - 2) He called the dry ground land and the water gathered into one place he called seas.
  - 3) Up to this point the Lord has been giving shape and form.
  - 4) Now he begins to fill it.
  - 5) God causes the land to produce vegetation:
    - i) Plants that have seeds in them so they can reproduce themselves.
    - ii) Trees that have fruit with seed<sup>in them</sup> so~~s~~ they can reproduce themselves.
- e. Day 4
  - 1) He creates the sun, moon and stars and they are put into the expanse.
  - 2) There are three purposes for these luminary bodies:
    - i) To separate the day from the night
    - ii) To give light upon the earth
      - a) Sun for the day
      - b) Moon and the stars at night
    - iii) To mark the seasons, days and years
- f. Day 5
  - 1) The Lord continues to fill the earth.
  - 2) He creates the birds of the air and tells them to increase and multiply.
  - 3) He creates all the sea life and are told to multiply and fill the sea.
- g. Day 6
  - 1) God creates the animals (livestock, animals that creep on the ground).
  - 2) God creates man.
    - i) 1:26-27
      - a) "Us" and "our" refers to the Trinity.
      - b) God made man in the likeness of God and gave him rule over the earth and everything in it.
