 - a) Some theologians refer to the essential image of God in man.
 - b) God is a spiritual being and man is a spiritual being.
 - c) God is a rational being and man ^{is} has a rational being (even after the fall this is true as James 3:9 shows).
 - d) God is a moral being and man is a moral being. God has a conscience that always binds him to do the right. ^{Man} man has a conscience that is given him which accuses him if he disobeys the law of God or excuses him if he obeys the law of God.
 - e) God is a volitional being and man is a volitional being.

- iv) He also gave him dominion over all of the animal creation.

 - a) He was to eat vegetation.
 - b) It was a meat-free diet.
