

- k. 3:8-13
 - 1) Then the Lord comes into the garden.
 - 2) What did Adam do? Did he confess his sin and take responsibility for what he did? No.
 - 3) He shifted the blame.
 - 4) Eve then shifted the blame
- l. 3:14-24 - The consequences of sin
 - 1) The Lord starts off with the serpent
 - i) He is going to be cursed above all other animals.
 - ii) He is going to crawl on the ground and eat dust.
 - 2) The Lord then addresses Satan who spoke through the serpent
 - i) The Lord says, "I am going to put hatred between you, ^{Satan} Satan and the woman, between your descendants and the woman's descendants and there is going to come one from the woman who is going to crush your head."
 - ii) That means that Satan is to be absolutely destroyed.
 - iii) In addition to that Satan is going to strike the heel of this one who comes from the woman. Satan is going to injure him, but not destroy him.
 - iv) This one who is going to come is Christ.
 - v) Right here the Lord promises that a Redeemer is going to come. Satan will injure the Redeemer, but the Redeemer will destroy Satan and provide salvation for man who has fallen into sin.
 - vi) Here is the first promise of a Redeemer who was to come.
 - 3) Then the Lord speaks to the woman and pronounces judgments upon her
 - i) Pain in childbirth
 - ii) Her desire will be for her husband and he will rule over her
