        - iv) His brothers hated him more.
      - 2) 2nd dream
        - i) In this dream, there was the sun, the moon, and eleven stars.
          - a) The sun stands for Jacob.
          - b) The moon stands for Joseph's mother.
          - c) The eleven stars stands for the 11 brothers.
