 - i) If you do that to every baby boy, Israel will be left with woman and no men.
 - ii) The promises of the Lord won't be able to be fulfilled.
 - iii) The Lord isn't going to let Pharaoh get away with that.
- ii. The deliverer (2-4)
 - a. Moses' birth and early life (2)
 - 1) A man and woman from the house of Levi get married and have a baby boy.
 - 2) The mother hid the baby for three months, but she realizes that she can't hide him any more.
 - 3) She makes a basket and puts it in the Nile River to float among the reeds.
 - 4) She leaves the baby's sister ~~there~~ ^{there} (Miriam) to observe what goes on.
 - 5) Pharaoh's daughter comes down to bathe and ~~sees~~ ^e the basket floating.
 - 6) She sends her servant girl to get it and finds a baby crying in the basket.
 - i) Her heart goes out to that baby boy.
 - ii) The Lord is using that crying to get at the heart of Pharaoh's daughter.
 - 7) Just then Miriam comes up to the daughter of Pharaoh and asks, "Would you like me to get the baby boy a Hebrew woman to nurse the child?"
 - i) She says yes.
 - ii) Miriam goes and gets the baby's mother. ^{baby's}
 - iii) Pharaoh's daughter ends up paying the ~~boy's~~ ^{baby's} mother to nurse her own baby.
 - 8) Finally she weaned the baby and gives the baby to Pharaoh's daughter and Moses is reared ~~there~~ ^{there} in Egypt.
