e) Then Moses says, "I am going to let you set the time when the frogs will be removed so that you know that the LORD is the One in control and he'llfemove themtomerrow."
f) Pharaoh tells him to remove them the next day.
g) The next day, the frogs died and then they gathered all the dead frogs into piles all over Egypt.
h) But then the Lord hardened Pharaoh's heart so that he would not let the people go.
ii) 3rd plague-gnats Eyypitan mugic.iten
a) The third plague was gnats.
b) The Lord tells Moses, "Moses I want you to have Aaron and take that staff and touch the dust of the earth. When you touch the dust of the earth, all that dust will turn into gnats. And there will be gnats all over Egypt."
c) But Pharaoh's heart was still hardened and he wouldn't let the people go.
d) The Lord then tells Moses, "Go to Pharaoh and tell him that we are going to bring another plague."
e) What was the plague?
iii) 4th plague - flies
a) This time the Lord told Moses to tell Pharaoh that while the flies were going to come in Egypt, they weren't going to come in Israel.
b) This is the first time a distinction is made.
c) The Lord was going to make a distinction so that Pharaoh would understand that Jehovah was not only the God of Israel so that he can protect them, but he is also the God of Egypt so that he can bring flies there.
d) They tells Pharaoh, "You are going to have swarms of flies in your houses, in your palace and everywhere.
e) Since Pharaoh wouldn't let the people go, the Lord sent the flies.
f) Finally Pharaoh couldn't stand the flies any more and he tells Moses, "Alright, you can go and worship the Lord, but you do it here in Egypt."
g) But Moses says, "If we worship the Lord and offer the kind of sacrifices that are worshipped here in Egypt, the Egyptians will stone us. We are not going to do that. We are going to go on the three day journey, just like the Lord said."
