

- vi) That night at midnight, the Lord went through Egypt and killed the first born in every house that did not have the blood on the door posts.
 - vii) Finally Pharaoh had enough and called Moses and said, "Take your people and get out. Take your livestock and get out."
 - viii) The officials in Egypt said, "Get out or we are all going to die."
 - ix) The total number of people
 - a) Moses had 600,000 men 20 years and older (this is talking about men who would serve in the armed forces in Israel.
 - b) They also had women and children with them so that they totaled nearly 2 million people.
 - x) Before they leave, they go to the Egyptians (the Lord had made them favorably disposed toward the Egyptians), just like the Lord had commanded them and asked them for articles of gold, silver and clothing.
 - xi) Thus Israel plundered Egypt as they went out just as the Lord predicted in Genesis 15. *knowingly wrapped in clothes*
 - xii) They had their dough in troughs that they carried.
 - xiii) When they came out, they had to eat unleavened bread and celebrate the feast of unleavened bread so that they would remember how they were delivered from Egypt.
 - xiv) They had been in Egypt for 430 years.
 - xv) The date of the Exodus is 1449 B. C.
- 2) Exodus 13
- i) When they come out of Egypt, they come to Succoth.
- 3) The Lord does a couple of things
- i) The first thing the Lord does is to say to Moses, "Tell the people of Israel that the first born of every family is to be consecrated to the Lord."
 - a) That was to remind them of how the Lord delivered them out of Egypt.
 - b) Every firstborn of the Israelites who put the blood over the door was ~~spread~~ ^{sprinkled} that night.
 - c) He also says the first born belong to him and they are to be redeemed with money. And every time the firstborn would be redeemed, Israel would be reminded of how the Lord brought them out of Egypt and spared the firstborn son of every family and the firstborn male animal of every family. And the male animal first born would be given to the Lord.
