- d) They didn't know what to call it, so they called it "manna."
- 6) The Lord gives explicit instructions about the food.
 - i) He says that this is the food they are going to have for 40 years.
 - ii) He said, "Here's what you are to do. Each person is to have a homer of manna each day. You go out in the morning and get enough for that day.
 - iii) You are to eat it that day.
 - iv) You are not to keep it over night. If you keep it over night, it is going to have maggots in it.
 - You are to do this for six days a week.
- 7) The Lord gave them these instructions as a test to see whether they would obey or not, but guess what? They didn't obey. Some of them had to see whether there would be maggots and so some kept them overnight.
- 8) Fin the Lord commanded them about what they are to do on the 6th day:
 - i) They were to gather twice as much bread on the sixth day.
 - ii) On the sixth day, without having maggots.
 - iii) There won't be any on the 7th day, but some had to go out on the 7th day to see if there was any out there, but there wasn't.
- 9) When Israel would go into the land of Canaan, they would have the Passover. The day after the Passover, they would have that manna, then that would be the last time they would have the manna because from then on they would live off the fruit of the land.
- 10) The Lord also told Moses that he wanted him to take a jar and put an homer of manna in the jar and that jar was eventually taken and put before the ark of the covenant to remind the people of the food that the Lord supplied them during their wilderness journeys.
- b. Water (17)
 - 1) The people of Israel come down to a place called Rephidim.
 - 2) Two events take place.
 - 3) The first event no water
 - They are out of water.
 - ii) The Lord had previously supplied water.
