

- b. Moses tells this to the people.
 - 1) The people were really distressed.
 - 2) They genuinely repent.
 - i) The people took off the ornaments that pleased eye that they were wearing because the Lord indicated that they were to do that if they really repented.
 - ii) They put on clothes which would express their mourning over sin.
 - c. Because the people repented, the Lord told Moses that he would go with them (33:14).
 - d. Then Moses wanted to see the glory of the Lord.
 - 1) This means he wanted to see God as he really was.
 - e. But the Lord said, "You can't do that. If you do that, you will die. But I'll tell you what I'll do. I am going to put you on a rock and I am going to hide you in the cleft of that rock. And I am going to pass by and I am going to cover you with my hand as I pass by. And after I pass by, I am going to let you see the reflection of my glory."
 - i) This was fulfilled in the next chapter.
5. Covenant reaffirmed (34)
- i. The Lord tells Moses, "I want you to chisel out two stones and I want you to go back up the mountain. And when you get there, I am going to descend on the mountain."
 - ii. The Lord is going to write the 10 commandments on those two stones.
 - iii. Moses goes up the mountain a 7th time.
 - a. The Lord passes by Moses and covers him with his hand.
 - b. The Lord proclaimed his name to Moses and when he revealed his name he revealed his character.
 - 1) Gracious God
 - 2) Compassionate
 - 3) Slow of anger
 - 4) Great in loving kindness and truth
 - 5) Forging transgression, sin and iniquity
 - 6) He also visits iniquity which refers to the temporal consequences of sin.
 - c. The Lord let's Moses see the reflection of his glory.
 - d. The reason Moses went up there was because he was going to renew the covenant that the people had broken.
