

- e. Moses prays (34:9)
 - 1) When the people broke the covenant, they weren't the Lord's possession.
 - 2) By asking the Lord to take them as His possession, Moses is asking the Lord to renew the covenant.
 - f. The Lord renews the covenant (34:10).
 - 1) The Lord says, "When you get into that land that I have promised you, I don't want you to make any kind of treaty with those people. If you make any kind of treaty with them, they are going to lead you to worship other gods. Don't have anything to do with them whatsoever."
 - 2) Then he gives laws about how they are to render true worship to the Lord.
 - g. Then the Lord commands Moses to write down the words of the renewed covenant (34:27).
 - h. 34:28 says, "And he wrote upon the tables the words of the covenant, the ten commandments."
 - 1) The "he" refers to the LORD.
 - 2) 34:1 shows this.
 - i. When he comes down from the mountain, his face was just radiant.
 - 1) When he came down and Aaron and the leaders saw the face of Moses and Moses wanted to talk to them, they withdrew.
 - 2) The people even withdrew from him.
 - 3) Moses wore a veil over his face, except when he would go into talk to the Lord.
 - 4) When he would go into talk to the Lord he would remove the veil and would leave it off until he had told the people what the Lord said so that they could see the radiance of the Lord on his face and then he would put the veil back on.
6. Construction of the tabernacle (35-38)
- i. Exodus 35
 - a. Moses comes down from the mountain and gathers the people together and tells them what the Lord said about the tabernacle.
 - b. He says now, "The Lord has a list of gifts he wants you to give them. No body is under any compulsion to give. They are freewill offerings and are to be taken and used to build a tabernacle so that the Lord can dwell among us. And the Lord wants those to whom he has given the ability to make the various items in the tabernacle to do the work voluntarily."
 - c. The people come and start to bring the gifts.
