- c) They had to stay right there because of the anointing oil upon them setting them apart for the priestly ministry.
- iv) After that week, on the eight day, Moses tells Aaron to step up on the steps that were around the altar of burnt offering and offer sacrifices first for himself and then for his sons.
- v) Moses had offered the other sacrifices.
- ii. Priestly offerings (9)
 - a. Aaron first offers a sin offering for himself and his sons that their sin might be removed.
 - b. Then he offers a burnt offering signifying the dedication of themselves to the Lord.
 - 1) They have to make atonement for themselves first before they can move out and make atonement for the people.
 - c. Then they go on and offer three offerings for the people.
 - 1) The sin offering
 - i) This is the first time that Aaron is acting as a priest and offering an offering for the people.
 - ii) The sins of the people have to be forgiven.
 - 2) The burnt offering
 - i) Signifying the dedication of the people to the Lord.
 - 3) The fellowship offering
 - Now that the people have had their sins removed and are dedicated to the Lord, they can have fellowship with the Lord.
 - d. While he is still standing on the altar, he lifts his hands, pronounces a blessing upon the people, and then steps down and he and Moses goes into the tabernacle so he can show him everything that has to be done there.
 - e. When you have Aaron, the high priest, going to God in behalf of the sinner that is a picture of Christ, our great high priest, going to God in our behalf.
 - f. Moses and Aaron come out and bless the people.
 - g. The glory of the Lord was then seen again and from the glory of the Lord the Lord sends down fire to consume all the sacrifices on the altar.
 - 1) Why did the Lord do that?
 - To show them that he was pleased with these sacrifices and that he was pleased with Aaron as the high priest offering these sacrifices.
