

- 5) The Levites are waved as an offering to the Lord signifying that the Israelites were giving the Levites to the Lord in place of the firstborn and were releasing them to the Lord to do the work that the Lord wanted them to do.
 - 6) As soon as the Levites were given to the Lord, the leaders put their hands on them to indicate that they were giving them to the Lord ~~to~~ ^{so} they ^{could do the} work he wanted them to do.
 - 7) After they were presented to the Lord, they offered first for themselves a ~~son~~ ^{sin}-offering and a burnt offering because if they are going to do the work of the Lord their ^{sin} had to be removed and they had to be dedicated to him.
- ii. Passover (9:1-14)
- a. The Passover was to be celebrated on the 14th day of the 1st month of the year.
 - b. So here is the 2nd year they are out of Egypt and the Lord wants the children of Israel to celebrate the Passover to remember what he did in delivering them from Egypt.
 - c. But when they were to ~~to~~ celebrate the Passover a problem arose.
 - 1) Some of the people were unclean because of a dead body.
 - 2) Being unclean, they couldn't celebrate the Passover.
 - 3) So they go to Moses and say, "Moses, we want to celebrate the Passover, but we are unclean and can't do it. What are we going to do?"
 - 4) Moses goes to the Lord and the Lord takes care of the problem.
 - i) The Lord says do it on the 14th day of the 2nd month.
 - ii) If anyone is ceremonially unclean, you have to go through a ceremony of uncleanness, or if you are on a long journey, then you celebrate it at the same time on the 2nd month.
 - 5) But if anybody could do it and didn't do it, they would be cut off.
- iii. Movement (9:15-23)

B. The journey from Sinai to Moab (10-21)

1. The trumpets (10:1-10)
 - i. The silver trumpets were made and they were to blast when Israel was ready to march.
 - ii. Then we have the order given to us of Israel's march.
 - iii. The sign that indicated when Israel was to march was the lifting of the cloud over the tabernacle.
