 - a. Moses prays for Miriam.
 - b. Moses forgives both of them.

 - e. After 7 days, the Lord healed her and she had to go through all those ceremonies for cleansing and she had to offer a sin offering and burnt offering to the Lord.
5. Viewing the land (13-14)
- i. The spies and their mission (13)
 - a. They come to Kadesh-barnea.
 - b. The Lord says, "I want you to send some spies out into the land that I am going to give you. Tell them to find out about all they can about the land. Find out whether the people are strong or weak. Find out whether the people are many or few. Find out about the soil whether it is good or bad. Find out about the cities whether they are fortified or not. And bring some of the fruit of the land back so we can see exactly what kind of fruit this land produces."
 - c. A person from each tribe ^{was} ~~were~~ selected to go to spy out the land of Canaan.
 - 1) One of them was Caleb from the tribe of Judah.
 - 2) Another of them was a man named Hoshea whose name Moses changed to Joshua.
 - d. They take 40 days to spy out the land.
 - e. Their travels in Canaan
 - 1) They go way up north to a place called Rehob.
 - 2) They went up to Hebron (Caleb spied out this area).
 - 3) Eshcol was located near Hebron.
 - i) Eshcol was the place where they found a branch of grapes.
 - ii) The branch of grapes was so heavy that it had to be carried by two men on a pole.
 - 4) They also brought pomegranates back so the people could see the kind of fruit that the land was producing.
