- nine and one half tribes (the two and a half already have theirs on the eastern side)."
- iii. The boundaries are given in chapter 13.
- 2. The territory over the river (13:9-33)
- 3. The Levitical lot (13:14, 33)
- 4. Caleb's portion (14)
 - i. The men of Judah and Caleb come to Joshua.
 - ii. Caleb says to Joshua, "Do you remember back in Kadesh-Barnea? Moses swore to me that I would be given the land that I had spied out because I followed the Lord whole-heartedly."
 - a. The land he spied out was Hebron
 - iii. Caleb goes onto say, "Now I was forty years old then. Now I am 85 years old. The Lord has preserved me 45 years (the Lord preserved him for 45 years to keep his promise to him). Now I want you to give me that land."
 - a. The descendants of Anak had been driven out by Joshua, but they hadn't been destroyed because there where still descendants of Anak in the Philistine territory.
 - b. And they had come back into Hebron and Debir.
 - iv. Caleb says, "I know those descendants of Anak have come back and though I am 85 years old I can fight just as well today as when I was 40 years old. And I want you to give me that land and I'll take it."
 - v. Caleb conquered the whole territory (Hebron and Debir) and possessed it.
 - a. Notice that was given to him before they started to divide the land.

5. Judah (15)

- i. They are going to start to divide the land.
- ii. They are going to do it by lot.
 - The way it works is that you have two urns.
 - b. One urn would have the approximate divisions of the land in it.
 - Another urn would have the name of the ten tribes.
 - d. So you would draw a piece out of this urn to indicate location and draw a piece out of the other urn to get a name.
 - e. Now what are the probabilities that Caleb's land is going to be in the land that Judah is going to get?
 - Caleb was from the tribe of Judah.
 - That meant that the territory that was given to him had to be in Judah's territory.
 - 3) Guess what they drew? The section with Hebron in it.
