10. Prayer Requests

The Pastor presents the prayer requests of which he has knowledge, and asks the congregation if there are any additional prayer requests.

11. Prayer Time

a. The people separate into groups for prayer.

b. There are three groups:

(1) The Men's Group

(2) The Women's Group

(3) The Young People's Group

c. Each group has a leader.

The leader of each group should be appointed and be respected as a spiritual person. The leader of the Men's Group should be a man; the leader of the Women's Group, a woman; and the leader of the Young People's Group, a man.

d. Each leader adheres to the following procedure:

(1) The leader repeats the prayer requests already given and asks the group if there are any additional prayer requests.

(2) The leader calls on someone in the group to lead in prayer to start the Prayer Time.

(3) The leader closes the Prayer Time with prayer at the proper time, and dismisses the group. When the leader dismisses the group, the people in the group go their respective ways.

NOTE: This isn't an order of service to be used in a church, but it is a list of the elements which may appear in this kind of Prayer Meeting. These elements have been inserted in the places where they usually occur. An asterisk means that the congregation is to stand.
