

33. The Pastor collects the juice trays from the Elders, and the Elders take their seats.

The Pastor collects the juice trays from the Elders to his left first, going from the outside to the inside; and then from the Elders to his right, going from the outside to the inside. The Pastor should be sure that the last tray he collects has enough glasses of juice in it to serve each of the Elders.

34. The Pastor serves the Juice to the Elders.

The Pastor serves the Juice to the Elders to his left first, going from the outside to the inside; and then to the Elders to his right, going from the outside to the inside.

35. When the Pastor has finished serving the Juice to the Elders, the Instrumentalist stops playing.
36. The Pastor takes his place behind the Communion Table and while holding in his hand the Juice which had previously been served him, says the following words:

"Jesus said, 'This cup is the new testament in my blood: this do ye, as oft as ye drink it, in remembrance of me.'" (1 Cor. 11:25)

37. The Pastor and the people partake of the Juice together.
38. The Pastor pauses for a moment of silent prayer.
39. The Pastor leads the congregation in a closing hymn, during which the congregation stands.
40. The Elders to the Pastor's far right and far left take the top tablecloth, reverently unfold it, and neatly place it back on the Communion Table during this hymn.
41. The Pastor pronounces the Benediction.

A good Benediction to use is Heb. 13:20,21.

42. The congregation remains standing for a moment of silent prayer, during which the Pastor retires from the Communion Table and takes his place at the back of the church.
43. The Postlude.
