- e. The Pastor pronounces the Benediction.
 - A good Benediction to use is Heb. 13:20,21.
- NOTE: The Pastor should use the Grave Service without a Committal if possible.
- G. Clergyman's Record

The Clergyman's Record is a record of the death of the deceased. The Funeral Director gives it to the Pastor, and the Pastor should keep it in his file.

H. Visitation of the Bereaved

The Pastor should visit the bereaved shortly after the Funeral Service. If the bereaved are unsaved, the Pastor should attempt to lead them to a knowledge of Jesus Christ as personal Saviour. If the bereaved are saved, the Pastor should attempt to comfort them concerning the loss of their loved one.

I. Announcement in the Church Bulletin

The death of any member or friend of the Church should be announced in the Church Bulletin. Such an announcement should also include the time and place of the Funeral Service, and should be accompanied with an expression of sympathy for the perceved, and a request that the members of the congregation remember them in prayer.

- IX. The Dedication Service for Infants
 - A. Purpose of the Service

The purpose of the Dedication Service is for the parents to dedicate their child to the Lord, and to rededicate themselves to the maintenance of a Christian Home.

B. Prerequisite for the Service

At least one of the parents of the child must be saved.
